The group also helps youngsters to develop personal, social and practical skills and promotes activities that encourage social inclusion, tolerance and understanding of differences.

The Queen's Award was originally set up to mark the Queen's Jubilee year and is designed to give recognition to the unsung heroes of communities across the country.
