

# Now it'll be safer up the junction

A DANGEROUS road junction at the corner of Limbury Road and Icknield Road is to be made safer.

The junction is at the moment a shallow curve, so vehicles can turn left from Limbury Road into Icknield Road without reducing their speed a great deal.

Another problem is that because this end of Icknield Road is exceptionally wide.

Many people, especially pensioners and parents with small children, are put in danger when they cross Icknield Road.

Luton Council is to improve the layout to reduce these hazards.

The pavement in Icknield Road is to be extended in several spots. This will make the road narrower. Pedestrians should find it easier to cross Icknield Road.

And the junction will be made squarer, to slow traffic entering Icknield Road from Limbury Road. New pavement ramps will be constructed, and signs will be put up to warn drivers of the changes to the road layout.
