## Next stop Wembley for the Bolivian boy wonders

AFTER lifting the Hatters Cup on Saturday, the footballing skills of Tahuichi are set to take centre stage at Wembley.

The Bolivian boy wonders (pictured above against Luton) have been lined up to take on a

full English Schools side in March, having conquered the best club sides Europe can offer.

They beat Bohemians from Prague 7-0 in Saturday's final, before a crowd of nearly 400 at Kenilworth Road.

But local youngsters too were in the spotlight with Luton-based Bangladeshi side Mitalee reaching two finals.

Their U12s lost 3-0 to Moorfields from Northern Ireland, with the U14 team going down 2-1 to

Cowley Youth from Bucks.

In the U13 final, St Joseph's from Luton lost 2-1 after extra time to Bohemians.

Tournament director Simon Spoor said the event had once more been a success.

"There has been some good football played and I think all the teams enjoyed themselves," he said.

"The Bolivians hope to be back next year, and we have had interest from Brazil and Norway."
